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Summary of CME

Day 1:

* Recent Advances in Gastroenterology: Dr. Ashok Kumar Behera

This session provided insights into the latest developments in gastroenterology, including novel diagnostic tools, advanced treatment modalities, and precision medicine. Dr. Behera discussed breakthroughs in managing inflammatory, motility, and acid-related disorders. The session also explored the impact of artificial intelligence and microbiome research in shaping the future of gastroenterology.

❖ Modern Therapeutic Strategies for Acid-Related Disorders: Dr. Sagara Mahapatra

This discussion focused on evolving treatment approaches for GERD, peptic ulcers, and Zollinger-Ellison syndrome. Dr. Mahapatra compared the efficacy of proton pump inhibitors (PPIs) with emerging alternatives like potassium-competitive acid blockers (P-CABs). The session emphasized the importance of personalized treatment strategies to enhance symptom control and mucosal healing.

Emerging Trends in Gastrointestinal Endoscopy: Dr. Suchitra Sahu

Advancements in endoscopic technology were discussed, including AI-assisted endoscopy, capsule endoscopy, and minimally invasive therapeutic techniques. Dr. Sahu explored the role of endoscopy in early cancer detection, polyp removal, and complex GI procedures. The discussion highlighted how innovations in endoscopy are improving diagnostic accuracy and patient outcomes.

❖ Interactive Case Discussions on GI Disorders

This session featured real-world clinical cases, allowing participants to engage in problem-solving and evidence-based decision-making. Experts presented challenging cases involving acid reflux, IBD, and functional GI disorders. The discussion focused on differential diagnosis, appropriate treatment strategies, and best practices for managing complex GI conditions.

Optimizing Patient Outcomes with Novel Therapies: Dr. Subhlaxmi Das

The session explored the latest therapeutic options in gastroenterology, including biologics, small-molecule drugs, and gut microbiota-targeted therapies. Dr. Das discussed how these novel treatments are revolutionizing the management of conditions like IBD, IBS, and GERD. The importance of individualized treatment plans to maximize efficacy and minimize adverse effects was emphasized.



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❖ Management of Functional Gastrointestinal Disorders: Dr. Sarat Panighrahi

Dr. Panighrahi led discussions on the pathophysiology, diagnosis, and treatment strategies for alcohol-associated liver disease (ALD). The session covered the role of lifestyle modifications, pharmacotherapy, and liver transplantation in managing ALD. Experts emphasized early intervention strategies to prevent disease progression.

❖ Innovative Approaches to Gut Microbiome Research: Dr. Srikant Kumar Behera

The gut microbiome's role in gastrointestinal and systemic health was explored, with a focus on microbiota-targeted therapies. Dr. Behera discussed fecal microbiota transplantation (FMT), next-generation probiotics, and the potential of microbiome modulation in treating IBD and metabolic disorders. The session highlighted how gut microbiome research is transforming gastroenterology.

Day 2:

❖ Understanding the Role of Diet in GI Health: Dr. Sarat Panighrahi

This session examined how dietary patterns influence gastrointestinal health, focusing on the role of fiber, prebiotics, and elimination diets. Dr. Panighrahi discussed the impact of dietary interventions in managing GERD, IBD, and functional GI disorders. The importance of personalized nutrition plans in improving gut health and patient outcomes was highlighted.

❖ Recent Breakthroughs in the Management of Inflammatory Bowel Diseases: Dr. Srikant Kumar Behera

Dr. Behera discussed the latest advancements in treating Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, including novel biologics and small-molecule therapies. The session explored personalized treatment approaches, therapeutic drug monitoring, and emerging microbiome-based interventions. Strategies for optimizing long-term disease control and improving patients' quality of life were emphasized.

Dr. Mahapatra discussed how these tools are improving early detection and monitoring of GI disorders. The session emphasized the role of AI in enhancing diagnostic precision and reducing the need for invasive procedures.



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❖ Insights on Gastric Acid Suppression Beyond PPIs: Dr. Ashok Kumar Behera

This session explored alternative approaches to acid suppression, including P-CABs, mucosal protective agents, and dietary interventions. Dr. Behera discussed the limitations of long-term PPI use and the need for safer, more effective treatment options. The focus was on optimizing acid suppression strategies for better patient outcomes.

Discussion on Clinical Pathways

The event concluded with a panel discussion on developing standardized clinical pathways for gastroenterology. Experts emphasized the importance of guideline-based care, multidisciplinary collaboration, and integrating emerging therapies into clinical practice. The session aimed to streamline patient management and improve treatment efficacy.

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
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
